Comments

As an exchange student, you will enroll in courses with degree-seeking UW-Madison students. UW-Madison does not offer any courses meant only for exchange students.

UW-Madison offers a huge amount of courses in many different fields of study. UW-Madison students frequently take courses outside of their subject/department of choice (known as a major). As an exchange student, you will also have the ability to enroll in courses in a variety of departments. It's important for you to be as flexible as possible when it comes to your course selections. Some courses at UW-Madison are in higher demand than others, which results in them reaching enrollment capacity quickly. UW-Madison degree-seeking students receive enrollment priority for certain classes. We are not able to guarantee you a space in any particular course.

Restrictions

Exchange students are rarely, if ever, allowed to enroll in courses from UW-Madison professional schools (Medicine, Veterinary Medicine, Pharmacy, Nursing, Law, Education, etc). Some courses (for example, Economics) are open to exchange students, but are very popular and fill quickly during enrollment time. Within any single department, there may be some courses which are not open to exchange students, or fill entirely with UW-Madison degree-seeking students.

Business Exchange students receive priority enrollment for courses in the Wisconsin School of Business. Therefore, if you are not participating on a Business Exchange Program you may have to wait until after the regular enrollment period is complete or even until you arrive in Madison to enroll in these courses. Many business courses fill up quickly. IAP and Engineering exchange students should not assume they can enroll in business courses when making decisions about whether to attend the UW-Madison exchange program.
